Term 1 Report Card	The Term 1 Report Card will be issued on November 15th and will count for <b>20%</b> of the final mark for the year.					
Term 2 Report Card	The Term 2 Report Card will be issued on March 15th and will count for <b>20%</b> of the final mark for the year.					
Term 3 Report Card	The Term 3 Report Card will be issued on June 26th and will count for <b>60%</b> of the final mark for the year.					
Parent Teacher Meetings	Parent- teacher meetings will be held the evening of November 16 <sup>th</sup> and February 8 <sup>th</sup> .
