6.1 Principal's Report

- A heartfelt thank you to our Home & School and FHJR parents Claudia Escudero and Steven Williams for spreading some joy to the staff with the Home & School coffee cart on Thursday, Nov. 18th. It was truly appreciated.
- Interim, report cards were sent out on Monday, November 15th.
- Parent Teacher Interviews were held on Nov. 18th and 19th. Participation was very high. If a parent forgot register, a phone call was made to reach out to schedule one as we believe these meetings are so important.
- We are in Week 2 of our food drive. FHJR families have been very generous. We have had great feedback about the themed weeks approach.

6.2 H&S Report

- School clothing should be delivered in the first week of December, with the pink t-shirts being ready on November 22nd, just in time for the first pink t-shirt day on November 24th.
- Our first book fair of the year is currently going on, and as of now, 148 books have been sold. The next bookfair will be in April/May of this year.
- The Support Forest Hill campaign is in full swing, and \$2870 has been raised so far. This money will go towards improvements to the playground. A committee has been put together comprising of both parents and teachers, and they will decide how to spend the money raised. Home & School has donated \$5000 towards this project.
- We have started our FlipGive advertisement once again, and have currently raised approximately \$405 through this initiative, which includes the \$280 that was cashed out last year. We hope to encourage many parents to sign up, particularly since it is now available through a mobile application, enabling parents to easily shop on the mobile and raise money for the school with very little effort.
- Food fundraisers: we are considering changing our Subway lunch fundraiser to another provider, due to the lower participation rate. More news to follow.
- We have begun the organisation of staff appreciation, which will be spread out throughout the year. The plan is to do 8 days, one each month for the rest of the year. Our first event, a coffee cart with doughnuts is being sponsored by a parent, and will be held on November 18th.
- We have 2 fundraising initiatives that we would request a vote from Governing Board in order to proceed with:
- Toy Auction: an online auction of new toys that have been donated to Home & School. This will be done through a Facebook page that has been created, and parents will have

the opportunity to bid on the items, with a set time as the end of the auction. Highest bid will win the item.

- Used school clothing collection and sale: Specifically for school clothes that are too small, or for children moving onto senior who no longer want/need their FHJR school clothes. Parents would be invited to donate their used clothes at the end of the school year/beginning of next year, and the sale would take place early in the next school year. Items would be sold at discounted prices.
- Our next meeting will be December 6th.

1. Executive Committee Report

- 2021-2022 Allocations to Governing Boards and Other Committees:
- The Executive Committee approved the annual allocations as follows. There is no change from last year.
- The Lester B. Pearson School Board Central Students Committee: \$1,000
- The Lester B. Pearson School Board Special Needs Advisory Committee: \$2,000
- The Lester B. Pearson School Board Parents' Committee: \$ 5,000
- Funding for each of the Governing Boards based on the following formulas:
- Between 8 and 12 members, an allocation of \$225 plus .30/student in the youth sector and .30/FTE in the Adult & Voc Ed Centres.
- Between 13 and 16 members, an allocation of \$325 plus .30/student in the youth sector and .30/FTE in the Adult & Voc Ed Centres.
- Between 17 and 120 members, an allocation of \$425 plus .30/student in the youth sector and .30/FTE in the Adult & Voc Ed Centres.
- An allocation of \$157 for the Governing Board of Soulanges School.
- Any surplus funds as of June 30th, 2022 are to be returned to the school board.

- Spirit Weeks and Halloween activities are being planned
- Question of the month: Each month we present a question for all CSC student reps to return to their school and ask as many students their opinion. The testimonies and responses to the question are then brought back to the next meeting to share. The responses will be summarized in our future CSC Report to Council.

Pearson School Board.

- The first meeting of the Intercultural Advisory Committee (IAC) was on October 12, 2021. We actively participated in a two and a half hour virtual KAIROS Blanket Exercise (vKBE). The Blanket Exercise is an interactive educational program that teaches the history of indigenous peoples in Canada. The program was created in response to the 1996 report of the Royal Commission on Aboriginal Peoples, and is used as a teaching tool across Canada. It is a very powerful and emotional experience, as it takes you through the history of Turtle Island (Canada) from an indigenous perspective.
